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2. PRESENTER'S BACKGROUND

Jonas Bogoshi has spent about 20 years in the service of some of South Africa's leading private and public sector Information and Communication Technology players.

His working experience spans executive posts at blue-chip multinationals such as IBM and Cisco Systems; and more recently, SITA, the South African public sector's ICT advisor, service provider and procurement agent where he served as Chief of Strategic Services.

Largely regarded as one of the key driving forces behind SITA's recent turnaround, in the year that he has been in the role of CEO of GijimaAST he has spearheaded the transformation of the company into a high-performance organisation. In the first six months of his tenure the company reported an above industry growth rate of 18% in revenue and a rise in headline earnings per share of 279%.

He believes that GijimaAST has an exciting time ahead and says that his focus will be on contributing his experience to further enhancing its operational efficiency levels, delivery capabilities and the management of strategic relationships over the coming years.
